## **Julie Frauenholtz joins City as new Streets Initiative Coordinator**

*Position to oversee implementation of Task Force recommendations*

The City of Everett, in partnership with the United Way of Snohomish County, welcomes Julie Frauenholtz as the new Everett Community Streets Initiative coordinator. Julie will provide oversight as the City works with the community to implement the recommendations made by the Community Streets Task Force. She begins work on Monday, Nov. 2.

Julie is familiar with the Everett community, and has experience coordinating projects similar to the Streets Initiative in scope and size. She has previously worked with the Community Foundation of Snohomish County (formerly known as the Greater Everett Community Foundation), the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services and the YMCA of Snohomish County, where she successfully managed several long-term programs.

In her new role, Julie will help coordinate various Streets Initiative implementation efforts currently underway and will serve as a liaison to the broader community on streets issues.

The Streets Initiative task force, comprised of 23 Everett community members representing service providers, business owners, the faith community and neighborhoods, met for several months in 2014 to look at street-level social issues in Everett and develop potential recommendations.
